

Who We Are

Welcare has served children & families for 123 years We have 5 centres across South London & East Surrey

We put children first

East Surrey Centre & Redhill Children's

We are Welcare, a charity that utilises our Christian value base to support children and families in their time of need.

We exist to help families not only to survive but to thrive, empowering them to access opportunities, build support networks and improve their life skills.

We provide practical and emotional support for families with children up to the age of 13. Everything we do is focused on ensuring that children can have the best possible start in life and a positive future.

What We Do

We deliver a range of targeted social work and family support services, parenting courses, group work programmes, mentoring services for children aged 8-13 and a Children's Centre in Redhill.

We work with children and families in their own homes, our Welcare centres and other community settings, such as churches and schools, providing practical help and emotional support. Our staff and volunteers' aim is to build on the positive elements of family lives and to build trust, enabling families to prevent difficulties from escalating.

To us, every child and family is unique and individual. Whatever challenge families who turn to us are facing, we are here for them.

Highlights of the Year

- We held our first Volunteer & Supporter Awards ceremony in September 2016 to recognise and reward the achievements of our amazing volunteers, supporters and community fundraisers
- We were granted £40,000 from Lambeth Child & Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) to run a young person's drop-in and participatory photography group
- #TeamWelcare entered the British 10K London Run for the second year. Our team of 19 raised over £5,000
- Welcare won three awards in separate categories at the 2016 Bromley Volunteer Awards Ceremony

The Difference We Made Last Year

We developed our Volunteering Programme

Our volunteers are a key, valued part of our service delivery. They form a natural extension of the professional support we offer to the vulnerable children and families facing multiple challenges who turn to us.

Following our *Investing in Volunteers* award by the United Kingdom Volunteering Forum (UKVF) in October 2015, which recognised the strength of our volunteer recruitment and training, our volunteer programme has continued to go from strength to strength. Last year we benefitted from the support of 209 volunteers in a diverse range of roles, such as assisting with community and group work, providing individual help to parents and families in their homes, delivering mentor support for children, and administrative support for staff in our centres.

We have developed an innovative and comprehensive programme to engage, support and recognise the role they play. Delivery of our first fully comprehensive training programme for Welcare's Family Support and Child Mentor volunteers was held last year. The programme runs over five days and includes sessions on Effective Volunteering, Volunteering with Families, Safeguarding and Child and Adolescent Development.

We increased the number of groups we delivered

Last year we set out to create a programme of group work that is consistent across our services and that meets the needs of service users throughout the communities in which we operate.

In our 2015/16 Impact Report we referred to the Toxic Trio of mental health issues, domestic abuse and substance misuse, that can all increase harm and risk to children and result in poorer outcomes during childhood. Our group work programme aims to address these issues in both a preventative and therapeutic way:

MySpace A treatment and recovery programme for young people between the ages of 8-13 who have been exposed to domestic abuse. The focus is on helping children to understand and manage their feelings about what they have experienced and to prevent issues in future relationships

Strengthening Families, Strengthening Communities A culturally sensitive group work programme that aims to strengthen resilience and promote good parenting resulting in better outcomes for children

Voice of the Parent A group that enables parents to stay connected to the support of Welcare and other parents following one-to-one or group work. Each session has a different theme, such as preparing for work, self-care or managing behaviour, and helps encourage selfreliance and peer support

We enhanced our outcome measurement

We strengthened and built upon our use of the outcome measurement tool Outcomes Star and introduced two new stars that are relevant for our services users: Family Star+, which adds emotional wellbeing for the parent and return to work suitability to the original star, and My Star, which is specifically for working with young people. Each of the stars has specific areas for discussion with the parent, child or family, and they are mapped twice or more through the course of Welcare's involvement, so that change and progression can be demonstrated.


In 2016-17. our 209 volunteers provided over
