Who we are

Welcare is a charity working with parents and children up to the age of 13 in South London and East Surrey. Our services are driven by our Christian values, and we strive to empower families and change lives for the better, offering practical and emotional support to overcome challenges.

The families we support face difficult situations due to domestic abuse and parental conflict, mental health, and emotional well-being issues, social isolation or the challenges caused by loss of income, and the cost of living crisis.

Our dedicated and professional staff work with individual children and their parents to build on the positive elements of family lives and to prevent problems from happening via early intervention and breaking the cycles that may become entrenched.

What we do

The focus of our work is to provide both practical and emotional support and advice.

We do this by:

- Individual one-to-one family support
- Group work programmes for parents
- Caring Dads group programme which aims to improve the relationship between fathers and their children. It is an evidence-based programme specifically for men who have abused and neglected their children or exposed them to abuse of their mother
- CapeAbility In Schools group work programme for children in years 3-5 to build emotion well-being and resilience
- Practical support through access to grant funding and immediate support through our Families In Crisis funding



People we've helped: Myra & Mia

Mother and daughter Myra and Mia were referred to Welcare via their local domestic violence service after domestic abuse towards Myra by Mia's father.

Welcare group programmes for Myra - Strengthening Families, Strengthening Communities (a strengths-based parenting programme), and Mia - MySpace (for children who have experienced domestic abuse) helped them work with their peers to come to terms with the abuse and their feelings.

"I'm so much more confident and feel more able to understand Mia's feelings and how to help her — we're getting on much better now."

With Welcare's help, Myra and Mia have come a long way. Welcare also contributed to a CAFCAS report to support with contact arrangements with Mia's father, advocating for supervised contact. Mia has safe contact with her father, and is on a waiting list for a child mentor.
