

Who we are

Founded in 1894 by the Bishop of Rochester, Randall Davidson, and his wife Edith, Welcare began as the Diocesan Association for Friendless Girls. Today, we are a child and family support charity serving families across South London and East Surrey with children up to the age of 13.

The children and families we support face difficult situations due to domestic abuse, parental conflict, mental health, emotional well-being issues, social isolation or the challenges caused by loss of income, and the cost of living crisis.

Our services are driven by our Christian values, and we support children and families of all faiths and none, with a focus on those in greatest need. We are proud to be supported by Anglican churches across the deaneries of Bromley, Beckenham, and Orpington within the Diocese of Rochester.

Welcare's services

Welcare is a professional, confident, and creative organisation. We value the power of support networks and community connections, working closely with local services to provide timely, effective help. This includes access to grants and emergency funding for families experiencing crisis.

Our evidence-based interventions and group work programmes are proven to make a meaningful, long-lasting difference to the lives of children, parents, and young people.

Services we provide

- Individual one-to-one family support and coordination of targeted help for families needing a multi-agency response.
- Capability in Schools an early intervention group work programme delivered in schools for children with emerging social and emotional support needs.
- Group work programmes for parents including Strengthening Families Strengthening Communities.
- Caring Dads a group intervention programme for fathers to improve their relationship with their children, specifically for men who have been abusive or neglectful.
- Domestic Abuse Recovery Toolkit a domestic abuse recovery group for children and their non-abusive parent.
- Helping families access emergency and grant funding to provide immediate support.
